

Mystery of Missing Dynamite, ^{T.P.} 3 Tons Worth, Baffles Lawmen ^{7/31/70}

A Tangipahoa Parish deputy sheriff's office has much to go on," said Thursday there have been noted a spokesman for the Nicholson Co. Thursday. The 145 cases of explosives, including 7,000 pounds of dynamite sticks, were stolen sometime between Saturday and Monday morning from a trailer which was kept locked and parked in a fenced area near Robert, La., a small community near Hammond.

The fence gate and trailer locks were broken and the explosives apparently were hauled away in another truck.

"It doesn't look like the sher-

Nine cases of booster caps, used to set off explosives, were also stolen from the trailer.

The explosives and booster caps were used by seismograph crews looking for oil and gas in the Tangipahoa Parish area.
