SUBJECT: John F. Kennedy Assassination:

Bronson and Daniel Films

In response to the offer of the law firm of Sigalos and Levine, on behalf of its clients - Charles L. Bronson and Jack Daniel - to release John F. Kennedy assassination-related films, we have prepared the attached correspondence to Mr. Sigalos, the FBI, and the Criminal Division Office of Legal Support Services. Since the Sigalos letter is vague regarding whether the original films are to be released, it is hoped that our response (which expressly refers to originals) will force a clarification of that matter. The Sigalos letter refers to "a copy of their respective films" while it adopts the earlier HSCA position regarding release of originals in its attachment.

Since the HSCA was not bound by FOIA and Privacy Act provisions, a review by Fred Hess of the Congressional proposed agreement is essential. The FBI Laboratory will have to evaluate whether time constraints and limitations on analysis procedures are consistent with our desire to properly examine the film.
