ELLICOTT CITY, Md. (AP) — New York authorities have been notified that Maryland officials will seek to extradite black militant H. Rap Brown to Howard County for trial, prosecutor Richard J. Kinlein confirmed Monday.

Brown will first face charges in New York stemming from a robbery attempt and shootout with police before he was arrested Oct. 16, Kinlein said. The 28-year-old black militant is currently hospitalized in New York.

Once New York relinquishes jurisdiction, Kinlein said he would seek extradition of Brown to stand trial on a four-year-old arson charge and for jumping bail.

The arson charge against Brown, who had been missing for 1½ years, resulted from 1967 racial disorders in Cambridge, Mi. He failed to appear for trial here in May, 1970.

Kiniein was convicted of contamps of court last mostly for

his out-of-court statements con cerning the arson charge against Brown. Kinlein is appealing the conviction.
