I enclosed several articles concerning the reopening of the Robert Kennedy killing - I have no idea if this subject matter interests you but the investigation has been reopened which shows it is not impossible to get investigation reopened.

One letter enclosed is from my Congressman, Bill Gradison. His reply, as you can see, was more favorable from most. In fact I've yet to hear from my other Congressman Donald Clancy. The other letter is from Edward Kennedy. After I read his statement supporting the Warren Commission's finding I wrote him explaining why I felt his statement was not in the best interest of the country. His answer comes as no surprise. The last paragraph shows his true feeling. He does not want to get involved - most likely because he fears he could be the third Kennedy to be felled by an assassin's bullet.

I have been in touch with Jerry Kay and he is going to send you some articles he has. I will continue to save his articles and send them to you from time to time when I have a reasonable number to send.
