This is in reply to your letter of July 17, 1969.

As you may recall, you told Mr. Johnson of our staff when you were here that you had information from Professor Josiah Thompson that a portion of the bullet which is Commission Exhibit 399 fell off this bullet while it was being photographed. This portion consisted of a single, tiny flake of lead which fell from the base of the bullet onto a table while the bullet was being photographed in January 1967. The flake has been retained by the National Archives.
