SABOT

[pronounced sah-bow -- french]

1. A device that fits over the base of a bullet that allows it to be fired through the barrel of a larger bore rifle
2. Also A wooden shoe.

In this example, A 22 caliber bullet sabotated for a 30 caliber rifle

It is possible that in the JFK assassination, 6.5 MM bullets were fired through the LHO rifle into a water recovery tank. The bullets then recovered and sabotated for a larger bore rifle. When fired, any bullets or fragments large enough to have barrel markings would then be identified as having been fired from the smaller bore rifle.

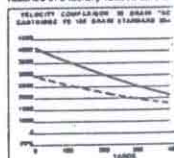

The secret is the sabot—a specially designed component made of red plastic that fits in a .224 caliber, a 30-06 caliber case. We use the fit, the larger cartridge case to drive the bullet at an incredible speed—never reached in a factory-loaded cartridge.



Here's how it works. The sabot has six little "fingers" that grip the bullet as it travels down the bore and impart full rifling twist for stable, accurate flight. These fingers start peeling back as soon as the bullet leaves the muzzle. Bullet and sabot part company 14 inches from the muzzle. It all happens in less than a thousandth of a second.

The Remington "Accelerator" was patented in 1965 and sold as loaded ammunition in 1977. The "Accelerator" is not available now as loaded ammunition. The sabot is available for handloading.

HORNADY SABOTS WITH BULLETS

Hornady Sabots with Bullets are packaged primarily for second season hunters who regularly lubricate Hornady designed in your killing chamber. The Hornady sabot is currently available for muzzleloading rifles.

To load, bullet must first be seated in sabot bottom. Push loaded sabot into muzzle with thumb. Seat with ramrod making sure that the sabot is firmly seated against powder charge. The sabot is not fragile, and will not push through. These sabots will closely fit the bore of your rifle. Since there are no standards for muzzleloading firearms, you may encounter some tight fits. Cleaning between shots is required with sabots to prevent plastic buildup and to help ensure proper seating depth. The use in firearms with bores significantly larger or smaller than sabot diameter will hurt performance.

Be sure to sight in your firearm before hunting, since a sabot will have different flight characteristics than a lead round ball or a conical black powder bullet. Sabots with bullets shoot significantly better in firearms with 1-48" or faster twist barrels. Barrels with a longer "round ball" twist (approx. 1-66") may not stabilize the bullet.
