G. O. RASCH, Vice President, Woodward, Wight and Company, Limited, advised that he served 25 Personel Manager for Woodward Wight and Company. He checked his files of all employees of the company and applications of prospective employees going back to March, 1963, and stated that he had no record of LEE HARVEY OSWALD, O. H. LEE, or anyone named HIDELL. He also advised that applications of prospective employees dated prior to March, 1963, had been destroyed.

Mr. RASCH was shown a photograph of LEE HARVEY OSWALD and stated he did not recognize it as being of anyone who had applied for a clerical position with Woodward Wight.

JOHN J. BARCELO, JR., Manager, Warehouse Operations Woodward Wight and Company, Limited, 451 Howard Avenue, advised that he personally interviews most of the prospective employees for the warehouse work of his concern. He examined a photograph of LEE HARVEY OSWALD and did not recognize it as being of an applicant for a warehouse position with his company.

Mr. BARCELO checked the file of applications of prospective warehouse employees going back to July 5, 1963 and found no application for LEE HARVEY OSWALD or O. H. LEE or anyone using the name HIDELL. He stated that applications dated prior to July 5, 1963 had been destroyed.
