Infiltrator Of SDS Cites Rebel Perils

LAKE FOREST, ILL., June 26 (AP) — A Louisiana deputy sheriff who said he joined the Students for a Democratic Society as an undercover agent told a group of antiradical students Wednesday night that if they planned to oppose campus demonstrations they should prepare for physical confrontation.

Larry Kihnel, 22, of the Jefferson Parish County, La., sheriff's office told 125 persons attending the National Student Conference on Revolution that he was head of security for the SDS national convention in 1968. He said his identity was discovered prior to this year's convention, which took place last week in Chicago.

Kihnel said he infiltrated the SDS chapter in New Orleans. He urged the antiradical students, who call themselves "squares," to take similar action and he suggested that any information about radical groups be turned over to the FBI.

He said students desiring to put down campus rebels should be skilled in karate.

"If the situation calls for a physical confrontation," he said, "then Baby, you're going to have to have to give it to them."
