Then there is the question of how the casings were loaded. Bullets of an entirely different character in this casing were readily available in Dallas. There is evidence only that Oswald did not buy any. This is proved in another of the Commission's burials, like the others reproduced in facsimile, in greatly reduced size. It is Exhibit 2691, an unsigned, undated, unidentified document bearing no letterhead. The tables of contents of these volumes are usually less informative than they might easily be. In this case, even less than usual is revealed. The listing is "Report of investigation of possible target practice of Lee Harvey Oswald in Dallas, Tex., area (CD778, pp.5-23)" (26H58-68).
