Political Analyst With CIA

Anne Papps Comanduras, 56, a political analyst for the Department of State and Central Intelligence Agency for 23 years, died Saturday while swimming in her apartment house pool at the River House, 1600 S. Joyce St., Arlington. Police listed the death as a drowning.

Mrs. Comanduras joined the State Department in 1942 and four years later was sent to Greece as part of the United States delegation observing Greek elections. Following that assignment she remained in Athens for a year as head of personnel for the United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation Administration's (UNRWA) office in that city.

She joined the CIA as Washington political analyst in 1951 and remained with that agency until her retirement in 1965.

A native of Detroit, Mrs. Comanduras attended the University of Michigan for two years and received a degree in political science from George Washington University.

She is survived by her husband, Paul, of the home; a sister, Platonia Kirkwood of the District; a brother, Plato Papps, of Bethesda and a stepbrother Tom Karamessines of Falls Church.
