#990-252 is Helm's response to Bankin's 2/12/64 request for "all information" the CIA had about Osmald before 11/22/79. The date as written on as 3/6/64.

There can be evasiveness in Helm's response, which does not say it and what had been given to the Commission are all such information. Rather does he say that he provides "an exact reproduction of the Agency's official dessier on Oswald..."

He also refers to the CIA's mean to the Commission of 1/31/64. This does not appear to be in the records provided to me.

Attached is an inventory of 30 items cent. It is hand dated 3/6, but a typed note is added referring to a 3/4 inventory "attached for all but addresses." Rankin is the addresses. This seems to say there was a different inventory, not provided, because there is no typed date on the attachement and the written in date is two days later. And it was given to Rankin.

It does not list a 201 file. It lists a request for one to be opened.

From other records I know the CIA gave the Commission a copy of the 201 file.

I do not know if it told the Commission that by then its 201 file had been decimated.

As of the HSCA testimony some 37 items of it were missing. They had to have been missing in what was given to the Commission or the CIA could have obtained replacements from the Archives for HSCA.

There is no reason to believe that the 201 file contained only copies or even originals. There is reason to believe it was made up of copies of other existing records

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It should have been possible to reconstruct the 201 file unless the CIA was determined not to reconstruct it, that it remain gutted.

If/either the Commission or the committee had desired to get to the bottom of this gutting of the file either could have.

The mome is Captioned to say that it is all the information the CIA had on INO before 11/22/63. But this is added to the end of the caption, by hand: "As Transmitted to Werren Convission."

This also suggests that the CIA did not transmit all to the Commission.

- 1. This refers to your letter of February 12, 1964 addressed to the Director of Central Intelligence which has been passed to me for reply.
- 2. Paragraph three of your letter requested the Agency to supply the Commission with a report on information in the Agency's possession regarding Lee Harvey CSWALD prior to November 22, 1963. The request was predicated upon the footnote on page two of CLA's report to the Commission dated 31 January 1964, entitled: "Information Developed by CIA on the Activity of Lee Harvey CSWALD in Mexico City, 28 September 3 October 1963".
- 3. There is attached an exact reproduction of the Agency's official dossier on Lee Marvey CSWALD beginning with the opening sheet dated 9 December 1960. The entire dossier carries the security classification of Secret and consists of thirty documents arranged in chronological order. On the basis of clearances from the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the Department of State, the Department of Navy, and the Immigration and Naturalization Service, who were queried by us after the receipt of your letter, we are able to make available exact copies of all materials in the file up to early October 1963. These include:

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- a. Seven documents received from the Federal Bureau of Investigation.
- b. Ten documents received from the Department of State.
- c. Two documents received from the Department of Navy.
- d. One document (a name check request) from the Immigration and Naturalization Service.

 - f. Five internal CIA notes.
- g. CIA report dated 21 January 1964 to the Commission which covers all substantive developments affecting CIA in the matter of Lee Harvey CSWALD from 9 October to 22 November 1963. The report indicated the disseminations of information developed by CIA that were made to other Federal agencies during that period. This item, as was pointed out at the time, is particularly sensitive and hears appropriate sensitivity indicators.
- 4. You will note that almost all of the documents carry markings required for CIA's internal records processing. A few of the papers contained the names of our employees or identifications of specific organizational components. We have taken the liberty of blocking out these items as they do not bear on the substance of the Commission's request.
