Soviets See U.N. Full of CIA Spies

MOSCOW, July 14—A Soviet weekly today accused the United States of placing Central Intelligence Agency agents in key posts at the United Nations in Geneva.

The weekly New Times also alleged that the CIA had set up eavesdropping devices in the headquarters of the U.N. International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) in Vienna.

The report said that, according to Swiss experts, 30 of the 44 diplomats at the U.S. Mission in Geneva were CIA agents. It said Austria was another major center for U.S. spies and the CIA had recently installed a system of bugging devices at the IAEA headquarters.

The devices were monitored by a 30-man team from the Foreign Broadcast Information Service at the U.S. Embassy in Vienna, the article said.
