The court originally voted 4-to-4 on a writ of habeas corpus. Acting Chief Justice Alvaro Ribeiro da Costa, under Brazilian custom, then voted a second time to break the tie and free Fernandes.

Cuba Shoots 4 as Spies For the CIA

HAVANA, July 31 (UPI) — Four Cubans were executed by a firing squad early today as spies for the United States Central Intelligence Agency, the Cuban government radio reported.

They were identified as Angel Paleo Nieto, described as the leader of the group, Jose Manuel Rodriguez Suarez, Raciel Royer Sarricqui and Enrique Garcia Pakomine.

The Communist daily Hoy said Paleo Nieto was executed immediately after sentencing by a revolutionary tribunal. He was said to be a former U. S. soldier who was trained in espionage by the CIA and who recruited the other band members.

Hoy said trial evidence showed the group had successfully transmitted information to the United States on troop movements and military installations, "especially during the October (1962) crisis."

Three other alleged spies got 20-year sentences and a fourth drew a 12-year term.

The executions were the first announced by the Castro regime in several weeks.

(In Miami, three Cuban exile groups charged that Castro firing squads shot 52 prisoners in a mass execution three weeks ago. The exiles said that the men had been captured two years ago while engaged in anti-Communist activities and that their execution was reported by relatives who were permitted to identify the bodies.)

Pakistani Youths Protest U. S. Acts

KARACHI, Pakistan, July 31 (UPI) — A group of Pakistani students, shouting for closer friendship with Communist China, today staged an anti-American demonstration in front of the U. S. embassy.

The demonstrators handed embassy officials a letter addressed to President Kennedy charging U. S. interference in Pakistan's affairs.
