I do not know if they have Mexico City phone books on file there. Or the diplomatic lists of other countries. But they do have our "blue book," which lists all U.S. diplomatic personnel throughout the world.

What I would like is copies of the pages of this blue book showing our assignments to Mexico City and the addresses of U.S. diplomatic offices for the years 1950-5, inc. The addresses are important.

So is that of the Guatemalan embassy in Mexico city for the same period.

Recently you told me of a city directory check in the National Press Building. I think this should be tabulated, both listings, and that you need not do it personally. ~~and~~ If it is at all possible to get someone else to do it, you should not. I am anxious to check these carefully. A phone-book check may later be desired. Same years.

Some parallel New York City checking might be worth the effort at least on one.

At some point this will have to be done. There can be advantages to having it done as soon as possible.

If you can find no way of having this done, please remind me to ask someone you do not know, Marsha.

I will not now be able to take time to reread this but if anyone does I think it would be useful to try to reconstruct what Hunt omits, dates. When what was done has significance.
