"Over the years the Central Intelligence Agency has developed seemingly intricate but actually statem for secretly transferring large amounts of money to organizations here and abroad.

The statem violates a basic intelligence principle, that each secret activity is insilated from others. The interlocking nature of the CIA system led to the disclosure of literally scores of the agencys operation

"Most common technicque was known as the "pass through", actually a triple pass.

First, agency transfers money to a "front" foundation...such as the Gotham Foundation, Bordon Grust, Lincigan Fund, etc.
None of these foundations is listed. with "foundation directory"
Next, second pass, comes from front foundation, that makes

a "contribution" to a prominent foundation known for its charitable and education organizations.

Third pass comes when legitimate organizations make contribution to CLA DESIGNATED RECIFINET CREQNIZATION.

Four PASS THROUGH OPERATIONS ARE THE M.D. ANDERSON FOUNDTION OF HOUSTON. THE TOUTZELLE FOUNDATION OF DALLAS, FAIRD FOUNDATION OF NEW YORK, AND KAPLAN FUND OF NEW YORK.

"THE BAIRD foundtion contributes to a wide range of RELIGIOUS .charitable. medical. education organizations.

THE "AMERICAN FRIENDS OF THE MIDDLE EAST RECEIVED \$150,000.

THE AMERICAN FRIENDS SERVICE COMMITTEE ASIGGOT 50,000 and the SYNCOS OF BISHOFS OF RUSSIAN OUTSIDE OF HUSSIAN GOT 38,000.

"Never had the Central Intelligence Agency's inner workings seemed quite so painfully visible, fight down to their very foundations. For fifteen hears the agency has been convertly funneling money through a mze of philanthropic funds to maintain students, tecahers, scholars, CHURCHMEN, JURISTS, union organizers.

"The techniqued seemed surprisingly simple. the CIA; s pet tactic was a "three layer pass through" operation for getting money from its own doffers into the hands of favored philanthropies, some knowing and some apparently not.

"First, the agency set up a score of dummy foundations, (like Price, Gotham, or Beacon), mailing adresses and mysteriously self replenishing bank accounts. THESE FRONTS SHOW UP NEITHER IN STANDARD FOUNDATION DIRECTORIES NOR IN THE FILES OF THE INTERANL REVENUE

"For the "Pass through" the CIA adoped 30 of the 15,000 authentic roundations operating in the U.S. amd made them CONDUITS TO THE RECIPIENT GROUPS. "We were approached about three years ago by a representative of the CIA, "said willaim P. HOBBY JR, PRESIDENT OF THE HOUSTON POST AND TRUSTEE OF THE HOBBY FOUNDATION."WE WERE TOLD THAT IF WE COOPERATED, WE WOULD RECEIVE CERTAIN FHNDS FROM THE CIA. ... MOST SIMPLY THOUGHT ANSWERED A CALL TO PATRIOTIC DUTY"

"What the CIA was doing was secretely underwriting a miscellany of American organizations abroad, sometimes as cover for intelligence tahtering, more often to MOUNT A SOCIAL DEMORRETIC COUNTERFORCE TO COMMUNIST PROPOGANDA

Mr. Hobby said "Substantial sums were involved" He delined to say specificall how the money had been transerred to the foundation before being passed on to designated organizations... Mr. Hobby said the Hobby Foundation passed on funds for the first time two or three years abo. In 1963 the foundation made grants to the following organizations involved In overseas activities; "AMERICAN FRIENDS OF THE MIDDLE EAST. \$50,000. Mr. Hobby declined to say which organizations had been designated by the 1 intelligence agency to receive contributions. In 1964, American friends of the Middle East received \$75,000 Berliner Verein \$100,000 In 1965 THE FOREIGN POLICY ASSOCIATION, THE INSTITUTE OF International Education, Project of Hope and People to People each got \$500.; COMMITTE OF CORRESPONDENCE \$5,000 Berliner Verein \$100,000.
