LBJ Is Asked to Block CIA Funds to Society

Sen. Hugh Scott (R-Pa.) asked President Johnson yesterday to stop immediately the flow of Central Intelligence Agency funds through private foundations to the American Friends of the Middle East. He said the organization's principal objective is anti-Israel propaganda.

In a letter to Mr. Johnson, Scott listed nine foundations that he said had contributed a total of \$2,345,000 to the organization, which he said "functions primarily as a forum for pro-Arab and anti-Israel speeches in the United States."

Scott listed the following foundations as conduits for CIA funds to the organization, along with the amounts he said they had given:

Baird, \$150,000; Brown, \$150,000; Dearborn, \$1.5 million; Granary, \$75,000; Hobby, \$175,000; Jones, \$50,000; Jones-O'Donnell, \$35,000; Marshall, \$65,000, and San Jacinto, \$250,000.
