Harold M. Koch, a former ligence Agency cover organi-Roman Catholic priest from zation, it has been learned. Chicago who defected to the Soviet Union, once worked briefly for a Central Intel-

During the summer of 1964, Koch was an employe of Radio Liberty, which broad-coasts anti-Communist pro-grams to the Soviet Union from headquarters in Munich, West Germany.
The New York Times re-

vealed last April that Radio Liberty, ostensibly a private company, in fact provides "cover for CIA-financed or-ganizations."

It could not be immediately determined, however, if Koch's connection with Radio Liberty adds a national security dimension to his defection. He appeared on Moscow television Tuesday and denounces the United States.

A spokesman for the Federal Bureau of Investigation said the Bureau had no file on Koch and was starting from scratch in its investigation, which will begin in Chicago.

(In Chicago, arch diocesean officials have said Koch served there as a priest from 1958 to 1963 but left when his superiors advised him to undergo psychiatric treatment.)

State Department security officials were looking into indications that Koch may have visited Vietnam sometime in 1963 or 1964.
