

## More Control Over CIA by Senate Stalled

Senate Republican Leader Everett M. Dirksen, (Ill.), said yesterday a proposal to enlarge the Senate's supervision over the Central Intelligence Agency is in a "state of suspended animation."

Dirksen said that he and Democratic leader Mike Mansfield of Montana had informed President Johnson of the situation.

Dirksen declined to disclose the President's attitude, but it was obvious the two leaders had talked to Mr. Johnson about a compromise by which CIA officials might be ordered to answer questions put to them by Senate, Foreign Relations Committee members.

The Foreign relations group has approved a resolution that would add three of its committeemen to a seven-member group, made up of armed services and appropriations committee members, who now hear CIA officials in closed sessions.

Chairman Richard B. Russell (D-Ga.), of the Armed Services Committee, has challenged proponents of the resolution to bring it to a vote. They have delayed while Mansfield has worked for a compromise.
