Supposed CIA Office Is Hit by Blast

ANN ARBOR, Mich. (AP) —Federal and local investigators today probed an explosion at a downtown Ann Arbor office building that is generally believed to house the Eastern Michigan recruiting office of the Central Intelligence Agency.

"We're going out to the airport to pick up two CIA investigators from Washington," said a highly placed source in the Ann Arbor police department.

The explosion last night shattered the glass front on both floors of the two-story stone and frame building and blew a three-inch-deep hole in the concrete sidewalk in

front.

The Ann Arbor street directory lists the tenants in the

building as the U.S. Department of Defense, the State Farm Insurance Co., Phillips

Electrical Instrument Co. and the Pitney Bowes Postage Meter Co.

No injuries were reported. Police said they had no leads on possible suspects.

The blast bent a door frame, overturned furniture, knocked down pieces of the ceiling and broke windows in a building housing an office of Michigan's secretary of state.
