



Mrs. CHARLES ELLIOTT TILTON, III, Tubac Ranch, Tumacacori, Arizona, cousin of DOROTHY PIERSON DE MOHRENSCHILDT, has known sGEORGE since 1942 when he married DOROTHY. Mrs. TILTON said she knows of no subversive sympathies or activities on the part of GEORGE DE MOHRENSCHILDT but did not approve of many of his actions particularly in regard to his treatment of her cousin. The TILTON said that GEORGE DE MOHRENSCHILDT and wife DOROTHY had a child born in 1943, named ALEXANDRA DE MOHRENSCHILDT and that subsequent to their divorce in 1944, ALEXANDRA resided 1188. Mrs. TILTON until January, 1958. In 1958 ALEXANDRA vent back to reside with her mother in Paris and Italy and remained with her until approximately June, 1958, when she returned to the United States to live with her father in Texas. She resided with him until Pebruary, 1959, when the berriod GARY TAYLOR. ALEXANDRA DE MOHEKNSCHILET prosently married to DONALD GIBSON and they reside in Wing dale, New York. GEORGE DE MOHRENSCHILDT subsequent to his divorce from DOROTHY PIERSON married PHYLLIS WASHINGTON in 1945, divorced her and married "DE DE" SHARPLESS. He subsequently divorced SHARPLESS and married JEANNE (last name unknown) in 1959 and is believed to still be married to her. Mrs. TILTON said that in 1963 ALEXANDRA visited her at Thearanchi

at Tubac, Arizona, and told her that she had mot an American man and his Russian wife in Dallas, through GEORGE DE MOHRENSCHILDT. Subsequent to the assassination of President JOHN F. KKNNKDY, ALKYANDRA wrote to Mrs. TILTON and told her that LEE HARVEY OSWALD was the person that she had met in Dallas. Mrs. TILTON said that GEORGE DE MOHRENSCHILDT wrote to her several months ago giving his address as care of the American Embassy in Port Au Prince, Haiti. He told her that he had found oil in Haiti near the Santo Domingo border and was actively engaged in the oil business.

Mrs. TILTON stated that as far as relatives of GEORGE DE MOHRENSCHILDT are concerned, she knows of only two, a brother DIMITED BE MOHRENSCHILDT, who is presently emplyed as a professor of English at Dartmouth University She said that he also has a cousin, name unknown, who is or was married to a daughter of WILLIAM GIBBS MACADOO.

Mrs. TILTON said that following GEORGE DE MOHRENSCHILDT's disorce from her cousin DOROTHY PIERSON, he married PHYLLIS WASHINGTON in 1945. She said that she knew nothing about PHYLLIS WASHINGTON except that she believed her family was somehow connected with the United States Diplomatic Comps.

GEORGE OF MOHRENSCHILDT divorced PHYLLIS WASHINGTON

GEORGE DE MOHRENSCHILDT divorced PHYLLIS WASHINGTON and married a doctor from Philadelphia whose last name was SHARPLESS. Mrs. TILTON said that Dr. SHARPLESS was known only to her as "DE DE" and that her father was a prominent citizen in Palm Beach, Florida.

GEORGE DE MOHRENSCHILDT and Dr. SHARPLESS lived in Dallas, Texas, and two children were born of this marriage. Mrs. TILTON said that one of the children died in infancy from cystic fibrosis and that GEORGE DE MOHRENSCHILDT and Dr. SHARPLESS set up a cystic fibrosis clinic in Dallas. They were subsequently divorced and Dr. SHARPLESS is believed to have remarried and is presently believed to be in Boston, Massachusetts.

Following his divorce from Dr. SHARPLESS, GEORGE DE MOHRENSCHILDT married JEANNE (last name unknown) in 1959. Mrs. TILTON said that she believes they were married in Dallas, Texas, and that JEANNE had formerly worked as a designer for the Justin McCarty Company and Nieman-Marcus, both in Dallas.

Mrs. TILTON continued that many years ago she

had met numerous acquaintances of GEORGE DE MOHRENSCHILDT but that at this date she could not recall who they were or anything about them. She said that most of the people that she met who are acquaintances of his she considered to be rather "odd" Bohemian-type characters with whom she had nothing in common. She said that the only names of associates that she could recall were a woman VERAY-LIPOVAC and a man LORENZO (last name unknown), both of whom were associated with GEORGE DE MOHRENSCHILDT in New York during the time that he was married to DOROTHY PIERSON.

Mrs. TILTON said that in 1963, ALKXANDRA visited her and her husband in Tubac, Arizona, at the ranch. She said that during this visit, ALKXANDRA told her of an American man and his Eussian wife whom she had met in Dallas through her father, GEORGE DE MOHRENSCHILDT. Mrs. TILTON said that she dem not know nor does she recall whether ALKXANDRA told her what her father's relationship was with these people but that there did seem to be something strange about them. She said that ALKXANDRA told her that the man had gone to Eussia and had married his wife in Eussia and then brought her back to the United States with him. Mrs. TILTON continued that subsequent to the assassination of President KENNEDY, ALKXANDRA wote her and told her that LKE HARVEY OSWALD was the person whom she had met in Dallas through her father.

Mrs. TILTON said that she was unable to recall any other information regarding GEORGE DE MOHRENSCHILDT and said that although she did not particularly like him nor approve of some of his actions, she did not know of any subversive activities or sympathies on his part. She said that she received a letter from him several months ago in which he stated that he was at that time in Haiti and had found oil in a remote area near the Santo Domingo border. He said in the letter that he had invested considerable money in this oil venture and was beginning drilling operations with Brazilian and Argentine partners. Mrs. TILTON said she has heard nothing further from him and does not know how true his statements are. She said that he gave his

address only as care of the American Embassy, Port in Prince,

On March 18, 1964, Mr. CHARLES TRATCH, III, was contacted at which time he advised that he was acquainted with ALEXANDRA, the daughter of GEORGE DE MCHRENSCHILDT and also had met GEORGE MOHRENSCHILDT on several occasions. Mr. TILITON said that during his conversations with ALEXANDRA while she was visiting at the ranch in 1963, she told him little or nothing of her family and he said that he could furnish no information other than that already furnished by Mrs. TILITON.



Synopsis: Subject, a Cuban citizen, born \$\frac{1}{2}\frac{2}{3}\text{9}\$, Havana, Cuba, a pilot and singer by occupation, entered the U. S. illegally at Browns-ville, Texas, 12/27/60, and was subsequently deported to Mexico on 8/9/61. He was admitted to the U. S. on parole 3/9/62 and presently resides 806 Rast Monica Drive, Garland, Texas, and is employed by at Dallas. QUINTANA is married to a

Mexican citizen. QUINTANA resides with his companion, RAUL CASTRO BAILE, also a Cuban citizen, and a legal immigrant to the United States. QUINTANA and CASTRO are married to sisters. Information received that an automobile owned by CASTRO and frequently parked in front of the QUINTANA-CASTRO residence was observed to have displayed a sticker which bore the legend, "Kill the Kennedy Klan." QUINTANA's employer thinks QUINTANA and CASTRO are very nationalistic Cubans and are anti-FIDEL CASTRO, but in his opinion, are not anti-United States or are they dangerous to the United States or engaged in any activities inimicable to the United States.

On January 28, 1964, advised an automobile owned by the families of JUAN FRANCISCO QUINTANA MAYA and RAUL CASTRO BAILE, who reside together at 806 East Monica Street, Garland, Texas, had been observed to bear a bumper sticker on the bumper of the automobile which read, "Kill the Kennedy Klan." This source advised that following the assassination of President KENNEDY that attempts had been made to scrape this sign off the bumper. This source also advised that following the assassination of President KENNEDY a great deal of mail had been directed to the families of QUINTANA and CASTRO at Garland from points in Cuba, Miami, New York, and Mexico. advised on April 10, 1964, that the families of JUAN FRANCISCO QUINTANA MAYA and RAUL CASTRO BAILE resided at 806 East Monica Drive, together. He advised one of these persons owned a late model Rambler automobile which was frequently parked in front of this residence. Shortly prior to the assassination of President MENNEDY, source observed there was a bumper sticker on the front bumper of this Rambler which bore the legend, "Kan the Kennedy Klan" and the first word had been changed to "Kill." Freehand lettering had been used to change this word. The sticker had been on the bumper approximately six to eight weeks prior to the assassination. Immediately after the President was killed the sticker was taken off.

also advised that immediately following the assassination of President Kennedy the residents at 806 East Monica began receiving a great deal of mail from Mexico and Cuba. Advised that these persons continue to receive a great volume of mail and on Monday, April 6, 1964, the residents at this address received seven personal letters.

On April 9, 1964, SA WALLACE R. HEITMAN observed parked on the street in front of the residence at 806 East Monica, Garland, Texas, a late model, four-door Rambler automobile, bearing license PD-4976.

Dallas, Texas, advised on April 15, 1964, the late model Rambler which was frequently seen parked at the residence of 806 E. Monica Street, Garland, Texas, was owned by RAUL CASTRO BAILE. He said

CASTRO's wife uses the car. Curther advised QUINTANA and his friend, RAUL CASTRO BAILE, are employed by him as both these individuals have worked for him approximately one year. He said QUINTANA and CASTRO are Cuban citizens who were trained as duster pilots in Mexico for the Cuban government and later defected from the FIDEL CASTRO government and came to the United States. He said he believes that both QUINTANA and CASTRO are violently anti-FIDEL CASTRO and are pro-United States. He said he does not know of any organization to which either QUINTANA or CASTRO belongs and he does not know of any activities in which they are engaged which would be considered as subversive or inimicable to the best interests of the United States. He said both QUINTANA and CASTRO are very desirous that FIDEL CASTRO be overthrown and they are sometimes critical of the individuals in the United States who seem to be soft on FIDEL CASTRO. He said, for example, that QUINTANA and CASTRO had told him on one occasion they had attended the meeting at the Dallas Municipal Auditorium in October, 1963, when ADLAI STEVENSON had made a speech. QUINTANA and CASTRO told him they had carried a placard outside the auditorium which was anti-STEVENSON in context. not know what the pacard said.

advised that although QUINTANA and CASTRO seemed to be intensely nationalistic, he does not believe they would do anything to hurt the United States.

advised QUINTANA has a brother, a Cuban citizen, named ALBERTO, who also resides in Dallas and is presently employed by QUINTANA and his brother were working together approximately by year ago for by the name of two brothers got into an argument and JUAN QUINTANA quit his job and came to work for and has been so employed since. At about the same time, QUINTANA's friend, CASTRO, also came to work for

advised both QUINTANA and CASTRO are good workers and are learning to speak English very rapidly. He said he had met the wife of QUINTANA and the wife of CASTRO, who are Mexican citizens. He said the wives impressed him as being high-class people and he has no information which would indicate they are anti-United States in any respect.

added that QUINTANA and CASTRO have often told him they would like to go back to Cuba to reside but cannot do so as long as FIDEL CASTRO remains in power.

The August 25, 1963, issue of "The Dallas Morning News," Dallas Texas, carries an article which reflects Ambassador ADLAI STEVENSON had made a speech at the Dallas Memorial Auditorium on the night of October 24, 1963. This article set out information there had been various picket: outside the auditorium carring American flags and signs attacking the United Nations.

QUINTANA was born July 24, 1939, at Havana Cuba, His last foreign address was Sur 53, #159, Colonia, Ermita Churubusco, Mexico. He is described as follows: height 65 inches; weight 120 pounds; hair black; eyes brown; scars, vertical scar on forehead; nationality Cuban; white male; father, RAFAEL QUINTANA; mother, MARIA ALBERTINA MAYA; wife, GEORGINA SANTIAGO DE QUINTANA.

QUINTANA entered the United States illegally by swimming the Rio Grande River at Lightner's Pump, five miles east of Brownsville, Texas, about 10:15 p.m., December 27, 1960. He crossed with his friend, RAUL CASTRO BAILE, who was also apprehended. QUINTANA advised he had lef Havana June 21, 1960, at 9:00 a.m. on a Cubana Airlines flight to Mexico, D. F. He lived at Chiapas #148, Colonia Roma, Mexico, D. F., until September 27, 1960. On that date a got married to his present wife and moved into his father-in-law's house. The father-in-law is address Hexico, D. F. His friend, RAUL CASTRO BAILE, is married to his wife's sister.

This file reflects QUINTANA left Mexico City on December 26, 1960, and travelled to Matamoros, Tamps., Mexico, arriving about 8:00 p.m on December 27, 1960. They crossed the river into the United Sates and were later apprehended.

This file reflects QUINTANA said he and his friend, CASTRO, had attended two aviation schools in Mexico City; one, the Centro Internacional de Adiestramiento de Aviacion Civil and the other, Escuela de Aviacion Mexico.

QUINTANA stated many of the Cuban students attending these schools were Communists and supporters of FIDEL CASTRO. He said one of these persons was a person named (first name unknown). He said two men who lived at Chiapas 148 and who are studying to be airport tower control men are also known Communists. One is named and the other is named (last name unknown). He said

another Cuban named who lived at also a known Communist.

QUINTANA advised he wished political asylum in the United States because he could not return to Cuba as long as FIDEL CASTRO ran the country. He said if he were returned he could expect punishment. QUINTANA advised he had been going to Miami when he had been apprehended. He said he has a friend named who is the head of the to contact for aid.

QUIRTANA said he was an aviation student and had a private pilot's license issued by the Mexican Government, number 3934, dated December 1, 1960. He said he has 266 hours of flying time.

#### PRENSA LATINA

Prensa Latina (PL) is a Cuban news agency with headquarters in Havana, Cuba, and branches throughout the world. Prensa Latina, which was organized in Cuba on June 16, 1959, follows in its releases an editorial policy which is anti-United States and pro-Soviet Union.

On April 16, 1962, Prensa Latina filed a statement with the United States Department of Justice conceding that the agency receives the sum of \$125,000 (Cuban) monthly from Radio Difusora Nacional, an agency of or under the supervision of a ministry of the Government of the Republic of Cuba.

On April 18, 1962, Prensa Latina entered a plea of nolo contendere in Federal District Court, Washington, D. C., to a charge of failure to comply with the provisions of the Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1938, as amended, and was fined \$2,000.



The subject addressed a letter to the Director, Federal Bureau of Investigation, United States Department of Justice, Washington 25, D.C., dated April 16, 1964. The letter was received at the headquarters of the Federal Bureau of Investigation in Washington, D.C. and reads as follows:

"Lear Mr. Hoover:

"This letter is being sent to you, at my insistence, through the facilities of my counsel, Mr. Gus Rallis, in order to insure that it is brought to your personal attention.

"I wish it to be understood that Mr. Rallis was appointed by the U.S. District Court, El Paso, Texas, to represent me at my forthcoming trial on a charge of violating Section 2113 (a), Title 18, U.S.C., and is not cognizant of any details pertaining to the matter discussed herein, although such matter is most relevant to my defense against the aforesaid charge.

'My purpose in writing this letter is to advise you that since it is apparent the Federal Bureau of Investigation is determined to have me convicted of this deceptive charge by witholding pertinent information from the U.S. Attorney, you, as director of the F.B.I., will not be able to relinguish at least partial responsibility for the death of President Kennedy.

'My responsibility concerning the then prospective action of Lee H. Oswald (Albert Hidel) terminated with the dispatch of the registered letter from Joseph Kramer to the F.B.I. in September 1963.

"Since the information disclosed in that letter was judged to be mendacious by the F.B.I., as is quite evident, then with whom the responsibility lies for what subsequently happened in Dallas is rather obvious.

"Certainly, F.B.I. files in Washington, D.C. (or Miami, Florida, Mexico City, etc.) reflect who 'Joseph Kramer' is. And, such information received from a known Communist who allegedly had been effective enough to penetrate several U.S. military intelligence agencies, should not have been ignored. In this respect, the efficacy of the F.B.I. is the responsibility of its director, regardless of the actions or judgement of his subordinates.

"In any event, I shall not acquiesce to sit idle and maintain silence while the F.B.I. railroads me into prison on a phony charge, simply because it cannot have me convicted of other matters.

#### AT EL PASO, TEXAS:

The subject was given a jury trial in the United States District Court in El Paso, on May 4 to May 6, 1964, and on the latter date was found guilty on both counts of Bank Robbery, in violation of Section 2113, Title 18, United States Code.

An article appearing in the May 5, 1964, issue of the El Paso Herald Post, a daily newspaper in El Paso, entitled 'Bandit Suspect 'Wanted Arrest'", contained the following statement:

"Dr. Manuel Hernandez, phychiatrist, called as defense witness for Richard Case Nagell, today spent more than an hour on the stand. He testified in his opinion the accused bank robber had a definite emotional or mental disorder when he held up the State National Bank. Nagell protested his testimony several times."

The article further stated that NAGELL "testified he sought arrest because he believed 'that might provide the solution to an unmarital problem' that beset him. He admitted

his Japanese wife had sued him for divorce in California, but indicated that was not his primary problem.

NAGELL 'took the Fifth' and refused to answer when asked by one of his attorneys, Joseph Calamia: 'Do you adhere to the Communist philosophy?

"Replying in a steady, clear voice, Nagell said: 'I decline to answer on the ground that my answer might tend to incriminate me.'"

The article further stated, "Nagell denied he had any intention of robbing the State National Bank. He said he firmly decided to do something to cause his arrest by Federal officers.

"He said he parked his car in an alley where parking was prohibited, and went to the Post Office intending to fire bullets into the ceiling. He said he mailed three letters, one containing \$500 in \$100 bills. When asked who that was sent to, he said the Federal Bureau of Investigation knows. Judge Homer Thornberry cautioned Nagell that if he would not answer a question, not to add anything beyond his refusal to answer.

"The accused man said numerous persons were in the Post Office at the time. He said he looked at the ceiling and seeing it was rounded, he decided it was not a good place to shoot, and went out.

"'I walked away and came to this bank-I didn't know what bank it was-and went inside, Nagell testified.

"'I looked around, and heard a man ask a woman for some Railway Express Travel Checks. I was trying to make up my mind just what to do.

"'So I went over to the same place and asked lirs. Gordon for \$100 in travel checks, in \$10 denominations. I took out the pistol and held it up, like this--' pointing at an angle.

"'The woman asked if the gun was real, and I said it was. She moved, but I didn't see her if she ran. I turned away and fired two shots. I didn't fire over anyone's head, as some testified here. The bullets hit this close together'--measuring about two inches with his fingers.

"Nagell said the asking for the traveler's checks was merely a time stalling tactic, while he was preparing to fire the shots."

An article appeared in the May 6, 1964, issue of the El Paso Herald Post, entitled "'Rank Bandit' is Found Guilty". According to the article, after the jury in the United States District Court in El Paso found the subject guilty on two counts of attempting to rob the State National Bank on September 20, 1963, "Nagell leaped to his feet after the verdict was read and shouled the question: 'Why weren't the real issues brought out in this court?'

"Two deputy U.S. Marshals took him from the courtroom, but as he was taken away he shouted, 'They will be sometime!,' still referring to the undisclosed issues—that he never made public."
