CERTIFIED - RETURN RECEIPT

Dear Mr. Livingston:

My unanswered letter of January 7, 1967, reports your breaches of your agreement with me and demands return of all copies of the interview obtained by gross misrepresentation and that no further use or misuse be made thereof.

Thereafter it was used with libelous purpose and intent. I have been informed that arrangements have been made for additional libelous and damaging misuse by your agents. This is to notify you that I hold Capitol Records responsible for what has happened and may happen and to call upon you to do what you can to relieve the damage already done, and to prevent further damage.

There has flowed from Capitol Records a stream of false, misrepresentative and damaging statements, all hurtful to me, and copies of which I have.

You have also violated your written agreement of December 2, 1966, to give the John F. Kennedy Memorial Library a five (5) percent royalty in my name and it now turns out you made me this guarantee without having so arranged and cannot and will not do it.

Over and above your legal responsibility for all of this, I urge you to consider the harm you are doing the country.

If you are not aware of it and because in the name of Capitol Records the entirely false claim of impartiality is being made, you should know that the evidence of the Warren Commission shows that one Larry Schiller acted as agent for Jack Ruby in transactions involving large sums of money, for which he and his associates collected 35 percent.
