

Car That Kennedy Was Killed In Donated to Henry Ford Museum

DEARBORN, Mich. (UPI)—The armed car that President Kennedy was riding in when he was killed has been donated to the Henry Ford Museum at Greenfield Village but will not be seen by the public for at least four years.

The \$500,000 bubbletop car took four years to design and five months to construct to Secret Service specifications. The Ford Motor Company donated it to the museum. Ford had leased the car to the Government in the summer of 1963, a few months before Mr. Kennedy was killed in Dallas.

Robert Dawson, museum vice president, said museum officials had decided not to exhibit the car until the Kennedy children reached the age of 21. Caroline is now 20 and John Jr. is 17. The limousine is being stored in a windowless brick building at the museum.
