Museum Acquires Kennedy Death Car

DEARBORN, Mich., May 4 (UPI)—
The limousine in which President John
F. Kennedy was riding when he was
assassinated in Dallas on Nov. 22, 1963,
has been acquired by the Henry Ford
Museum, it was announced Wednesday.
Museum officials said that it had
been decided to preserve the 1961 Lincoln in long-term storage. It will not be
shown in the immediate future or in
the adolescent years of the Kennedy
children, the officials said. The decision was made based on "the tragedy
associated with this car," a museum
statement said.
