Your letter of July 8 arrived this a.m. just as I was leaving for Washington to return late tonight and to leave about daylight tomorrow for New York. The material is most welcome. I have glanced at it but hastily.

We have reached the same conclusion by different means and I am looking forward to a chance to study your material.
