

Chisholm Pledges Assassin Probe

LOS ANGELES — Rep. Shirley Chisholm said yesterday if she were elected President she would reopen investigations into the assassinations of John and Robert Kennedy, Dr. Martin Luther King and other slain political leaders.

She would bring in private investigators and not rely only on government agents, she said.

Mrs. Chisholm was asked about the assassinations while being interviewed on a local TV program.

Besides the Kennedy brothers and King, the conversation included references to slain Nazi leader George Lincoln Rockwell, civil rights leader Medgar Evers and the attempt on the life of Gov. George Wallace.

"Every one of them would have to be reopened, and ev-

ery one of them would have to be really looked into much more deeply," she said.

"No Cursory Reports"

"No more cursory kinds of reports, and no more reports on just the part of government agencies alone. Reports on the part of independent investigators, who would collect the material objectively and in a substantive fashion. And I think it is very, very important. This is the way I really feel about this."

"The more I think about the assassinations of the Kennedy brothers and the assassinations of others, I just seem to have a feeling that there is a deliberate attempt in this country to have this country taken over by certain kinds of forces, and that's all I am going to say."
