Dear Nick,

Even with comparisons like Henry Haile's in describing Foreman's investigation as "heroic" because he walked a couple of blocks twice and made a phone call to the same guy never getting anything in return. Literally. You might get some kicks out of Henry's Memorandum. I've never seen a legal ~~maxx~~ document less in contact with fact or truth. He even begins by apologizing for the lies he then puts on paper. In almost no case can it be considered ~~maxx~~ "unintentional," his word.
