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Dear Stavropoulos:

Last night I did a three-hour TV show in Washington, Channel 14. During the course of it the moderator suddenly decided to canvass his audience on whether or not they still believe the Warren Report, whether they think the case should be re-opened. He took the calls as the audience called in, and a dull show was no less dull without him. The first tally was 3 supporting the report, 38 against. That went to 4 and 38. Then the supporters of the old one reached five, those against were well over a hundred, so finally stopped counting ~~these demanding a new investigation~~. Those supporting the old one totalled only 5. More than 95% of this sampling of Washington opinion believe the murder should be investigated. Considering that there had been no warm up, no history of shows in this town or even this station, that this is not a progressive station or moderator, I think the statistics are impressive. I wonder if they might not make a news item for you. The moderator is John Fightner, Jr., son of the rather well-known AP correspondent. The station is WUSA.

Two weeks ago I agreed to a debate with McElroy when asked by a high school about 20 miles from L.A. (phone exchange for area, 344). Today they phoned to tell me that McElroy had agreed. I could have had this free, but he is insisting on an honorarium. My reply was whatever he gets, I do also, and I agree to a fee for nothing if he does. They'll pay my fare. Tentative date 3/22. I've insisted on ground rules that they draw up in advance, like a limit of opening statements to 10-15 minutes, of responses to 2-3 minutes each, and that there be a competent moderator. There will be one from the faculty. I'll let you know whom when I do. It will deal with New Orleans and a single assassin, a rather cumbersome topic. I do not really care what the topic is, but I suggested that they simplify it.

On the TV show last night I did what I have done in letters to the New York Times and London Times literary supplement, charged that the Roche statement that if there was a conspiracy, Bobby had to be part of it, that it was the White House effort at the political assassination of Bobby Kennedy, that if Roche did not know any more than he revealed he had no right to open his mouth, and that each of these smears, especially the one against Garrison by the CIA-Pentagon on his alleged medical records, reflected that much worse damage for Garrison. When last mention of the poll was made, I emphasized that this was the latest proof. I think it is an effective argument, especially when you sum up all the evidence as I did.

When you get to Bay, I think it would be helpful if he can spare it if he would send a copy of his Dealey Plaza chart to Gary Murr, 5B-1, Moffat, Ontario, Canada. Murr seems like a fine fellow, has offered to help me, has gotten the 36 volumes and is studying them, and has become interested in the pictures and, particularly Similes. If Ray cannot spare a copy, I will send him mine, the one Ray sent me in 1966. However, there may be an occasion when I'll want this, although I have not yet used it. I took it to the studio last night, for example. But if it will cost Ray money or too much trouble, I've told Murr I'll send him mine. I also told him how to write Ray.
