Cuban Gang Leader Of 1940's Is Found Slain Near Miami

MIAMI, May 29 (AP)—The leader of a political gang during the chaotic 1940's in Cuba was found shot to death today in a field south of Miami. He was the fourth prominent Cuban murdered here in 14 days.

The police said they had no immediate leads in the slaying of Jesus Gonzalez-Carta.

They said that Mr. Gonzalez-Carta had been killed within 24 hours of the time his body was found on the fringe of the Everglades.

Mr. Gonzalez-Carta, 53 years old, led an extreme right-wing group, Accion Guiteras, during the political gang wars of Cuba in the 1940's. He once served in the Cuban House of Representatives.

"I can't do my job and campaign against these guys at the same time," he said. "So I'll resign."

In 1944, Eduardo Chibas,

head of the Cuban Orthodox Party, publicly accused Mr. Gonzalez-Carta of killing Enrique Ravena, chief of the Cuban secret police. Mr. Gonzalez-Carta was never charged in the case.

A historian Richard Thomas, has written that Mr. Gonzalez-Carta was jailed in Costa Rica in 1957 for plotting to kill President José Figueres. Mr. Thomas's book said that Mr. Gonzalez-Carta told the police that Rafael Leonidas Trujillo, then president of the Dominican Republic, had given him \$200,000 to kill Mr. Figueres.

Mr. Gonzalez-Carta escaped from jail and returned to Cuba, only to be arrested and deported in 1959. He was sentenced to five years in prison in New York in March 1968 for his part in a plot to distribute \$1 million in counterfeit money, ostensibly to buy arms in Argentina for use against Cuban Prime Minister Fidel Castro.

The police said that Luciano Nieves, 43 years old, of Miami, had been hit by at least six .45-caliber bullets.
