They dont have to believe me now, but for gods sakes the facts in the case speak for themselves.

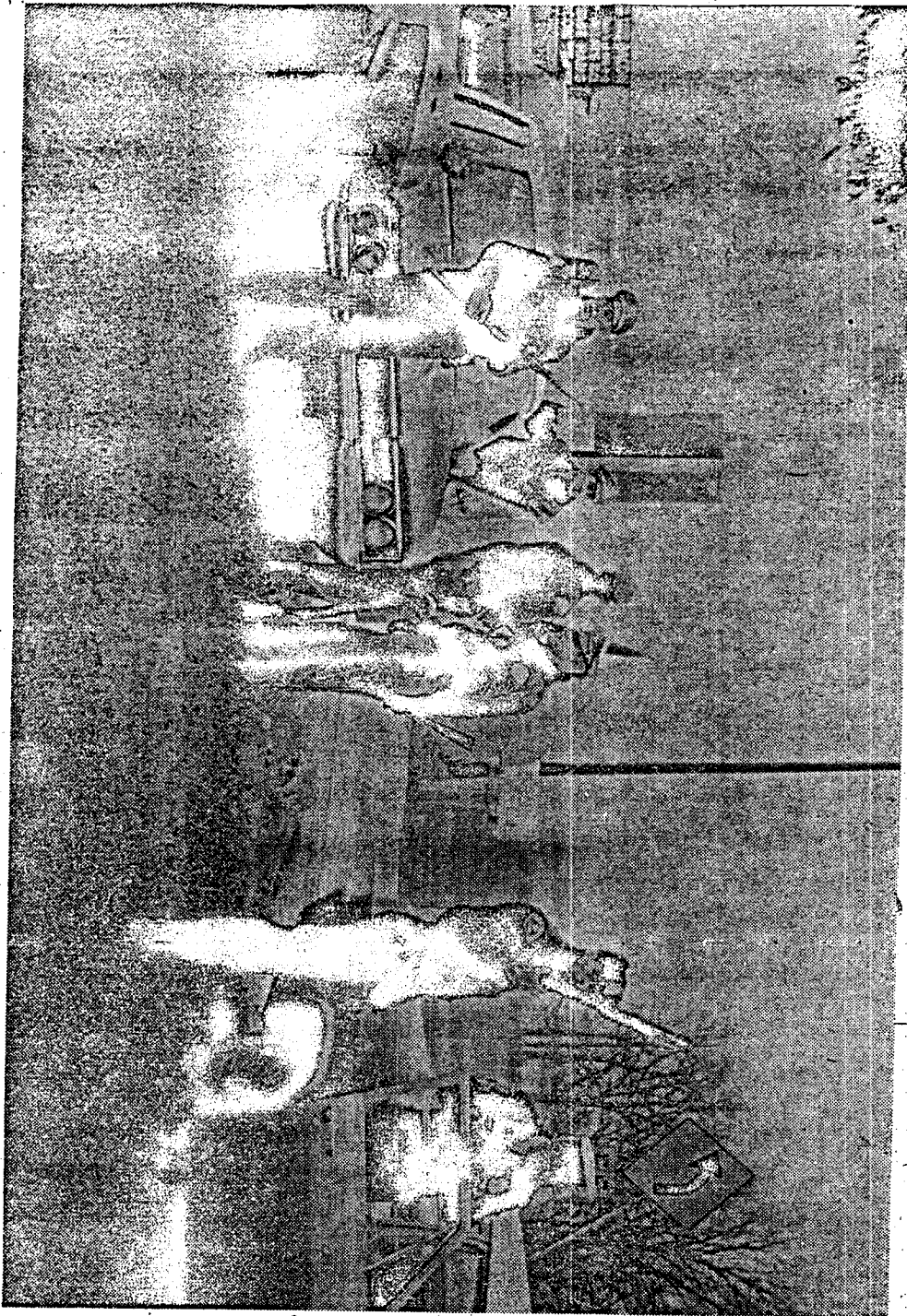
I love you all and I'm sorry I am crying so much while writing these letters today but I cant help it because I'm not guilty.
