Dear Mr. Pereira,

I am sorry a few health problems and other matters have delayed this.

I had asked two friends, both of whom have made deeper studies of this aspect than I, for copies of what they have. One has been too busy and the other has been away. Therefore, here is a copy of what I alone have. I presume that in the course of time these added requests will be answered. In one case the friend has much unsubstantiated material not of official origin he is unwilling to give others, especially because it is untested and in his view nothing but suspicion.

While this material has not been published, it also is not by any means secret. It comes from the publicly-available archive of the Warren Commission. The numbers beginning with "CD" are the file identifications. As you will note, they do not all begin with the first page. This is because the previous pages contain nothing of interest.

As I believe I told you, I do not share the prevalent suspicions about this man. I believe his testimony before the Warren Commission warrants my belief and disputes the suspicion.

Should you desire a copy of his testimony, it can be read at the New York Public Library. It is in Volume 9 of the hearings, beginning on page 166. Or, I can have copies made for you. Possibly the library can xerox it for you. Two pages will then appear on a single sheet of paper.

When I hear further, if anything seems likely to interest you, I will send it.
