'Exiles Say Cuban Mill Was Razed by Bomber

MIAMI, Sept. 8 (AP)—A Cuban exile group said today that a twin-engine bomber completely destroyed a sugar mill in Camagüey Province in eastern Cuba last night.

Dr. Orlando Bosch, head of the Revolutionary Recovery Movement, said the plane dropped six 50-pound bombs on the mill. Four hit the target, he said.

Dr. Bosch said the plane flew from a concealed base in Central America and was over Cuban territory for about an hour. He said it received only a sprinkling of anti-aircraft gunfire, apparently from guards at the mill. Otherwise the craft was unmolested.

The Cuban Government said Friday that two bombers escorted by jet fighters tried to raid a Cuban Air Force base in Santa Clara, central Cuba, Thursday, but were driven off by anti-aircraft fire.

It said one person was killed when the planes dropped bombs around Santa Clara as they flew away.
