Plane Hijackings Curb CIA Travel

These footnotes to the news have been gathered by reporters of The Washington Post.

U.S. officials have become increasingly concerned about the possibility that persons in sensitive jobs may wind up in Cuba aboard a hijacked commercial airliner.

At the CIA, it has been learned, personnel with high security clearance have been urged to think about other forms of transportation when they travel south. Those in "extremely sensitive positions" need permission from their superiors before taking a plane on certain routes.

A Pentagon spokesman said that no such restrictions are now in effect for Defense Department personnel.
