

Cushing Doubts Warren Report

Boston, March 16 (AP)—Cardinal Cushing said today "I never believed" that the assassination of President Kennedy "was the work of one man."

Cardinal Cushing made his remarks at a press conference on plans for the Boston Archdiocese.

The Roman Catholic Archbishop of Boston said he did not think the Warren Commission Report on the assassination was complete. He said of the New Orleans investigation: "I think they should follow it through."

The Cardinal implied that

there were portions of the Warren report that have not been made public. He noted that interviews and statements from world leaders about the late President for the Kennedy Memorial Library would not be public until each individual's death.

Cardinal Cushing, who yesterday blessed the new gravesite for Kennedy, said: "My heart

went out to Bob Kennedy" at the ceremony.

He said Sen. Robert F. Kennedy stood at the edge of the grave and looked down for long periods.

"In my opinion," Cushing said, "he relived the whole story of the past, of the assassination of his brother. I felt like going up and pulling him away from the grave."
