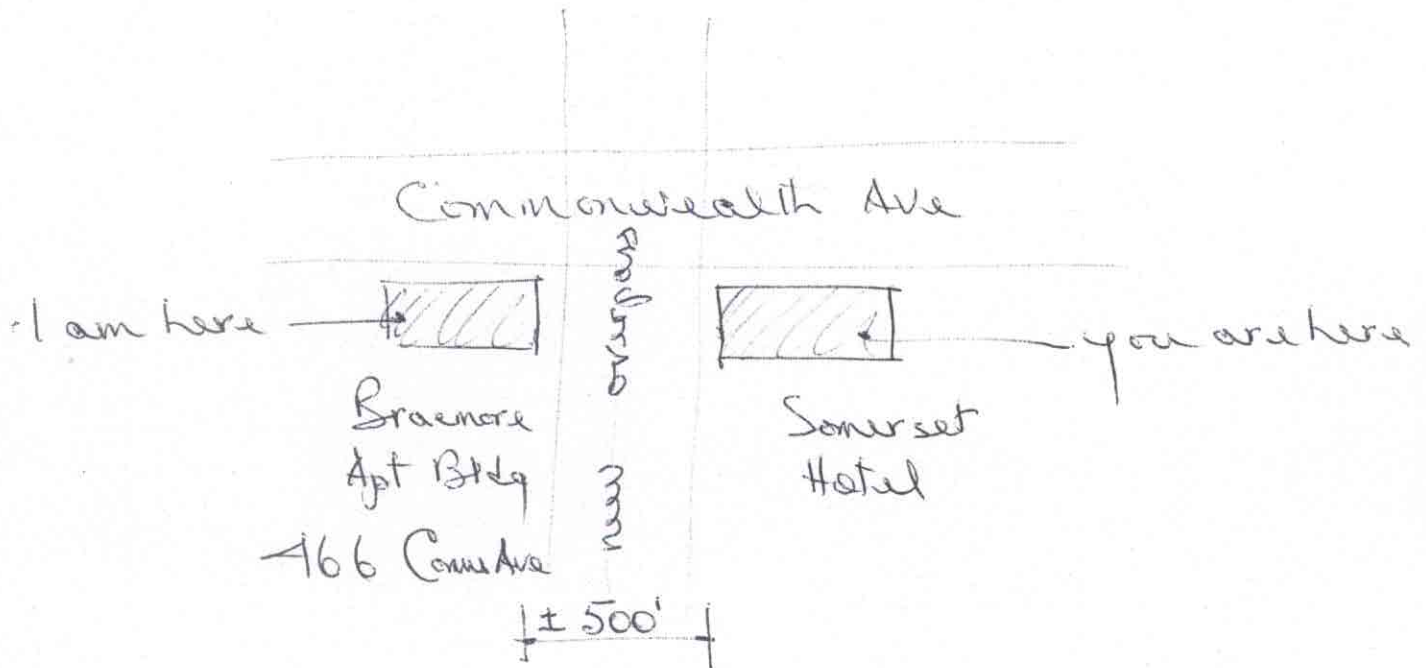

2/1 It is true that the mother said
 Oswald was left-handed, but she alone
 said that. There was no left-hand speci-
 fication on the rifle order. That is a
 right-handed rifle. No one else to my
 knowledge ever said he was left-handed.
 It could, of course, be important.
 Close examination of those photos
 indicates other reasons for suspecting
 they are fakes, but the evidence is by no
 means certain. If you have a chance, look
 for example, at the left elbow in Ex 749
 (the one of the pair without the rifle
 in his hands), and the thickness of the
 neck. Then there is the nose shadow, which
 goes straight down while the body shadow
 goes to his right. I have gotten an
 original print of both pictures and am
 not convinced that I can prove they are
 fakes, such as I'd like to. Thanks a lot.
 I'll be up your way next week, to be on
 WINT in Hartford and WNAV in Boston, 2/7
 and 2/8, resp. and possibly to tape for the
 future.
