I have followed with great interest and admiration your books on the Kennedy Assassination and the Warren Report.



Dear Mrs. Dunn,

I do indeed recall your phone-in on the Mike Jackson show, and I thank you for it.

That was a rather intensive trip, and I'm not yet rested up from it, so I hope you'll understand the brevity.
