And the sponsor of the resolution setting up a House committee to reinvestigate the as-sassination said Sunday he no longer believes in the "full scope" of the Warren Commission report.

Rep. Henry B. Gonzalez, DTex., rode in the presidential motorcade in Dallas when Kennedy was killed.

"I would say that now, I would have to believe in Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs and have that kind of gullibility to believe in' light of recent developments the full scope of the Warren Commission, Gonzalez said on an Austin television program.

The services Kennedy's assassination in Mayor Robert Folsom had be called off a memorial service citing "declining were made for the service public interest."

Monday's service will be held not far from the spot where the Warren Commission said Lee Harvey Oswald, acting alone, fired the shots that killed Kennedy.

"There will be no speeches," said Dallas County Democratic Chairman Ron Kessler, who organized the service.
