- 1. From a search of the Texas School Took reportiony building on the 6th floor a 6.5 caliber Carcano cartine rifle & C 2766, mounted with a 0-10 Japanese scope.

 This rifle was found partially hidden under some toxes near the back stairway.
- 2. Year a front window at the southeast corner of the huilding on the same floor were three spent cartridge cases, 6.5 in califor. These were protected for rictures and prints, and after this was done it was found that the rifle contained one loaded cartridge in the chamber.
- 3. I.t. The of the Crime Lab was able to not a palm print from one of the boxes under this window which proved to be Lee Harvey Cawald's print. A thumb print was also found at this same location.
- b. The Grime Lab was at le to get a palm print from the underside of the gum harrel near the end of the foregrip, and a partial print was lifted from the trigger housing of the rifle.
- So one large piece of brown wratting paper fitting the description of one used by Oswald in bringing a large package to work on the morning of the murder. We later found that Puell Menley Frazier, 21:39 W. 5th Street, Irving, Texas had given Gowald a ride to work on the morning of the killing, and both he and his sister, Linnie Man Pondle, can Oswald put a long package wratped in a heavy brown paper in the back soat of the car. After arriving at work, Verley Frazier saw Oswald take this rackage and take it with him into the building. This paper was shaped like a crude bap, large enough to carry this rifle. This was also found on the 6th floor.

Truly, 1932 "ade Irive, rejorted to us that one of his men was missing, a Lice Harvey Orwald, whose address was 2515 i. 5th Street, Trying, Texas. We also found that this man had been stored by Officer V. L. Baker while coming down the stairs. Mr. Faker says that he stored this man on the third or fourth floor in the stairway, but as Tr. Truly identified him as one of the employees, he was released. Officer seeing that this man was apparently running, two of the detectives and movelf left the building and care to the office for an identification check and other information, and soon found that he was the same man who had shot Officer Tirpit.
- The bullet taken from the stretcher used to carry the overnor into the bossital and fragments of a bull t taken from lovernor Connally's body were turned over to the f. T. I. who made an examination and, as shown in our report from there, these were, fired from this same rifle.
- 3. One sport shirt that Uswalu was wearing at the time of his agrest was sent to the F. B. I. Crime Let along with a blanket that ere. were vswald said the gun had been wrapped in while being kept in the garage at the home of Mrs. Buth Laine in Lrving. The F. E. I. examination shows that parts of each of these materials could have been the ones that they recovered from the gun.
- 9. Mrs. Harvey Lee Cawald identified the rifle as resembling the one she had seen in the carage in Irving.
- The During the search of the parage at Frs. Faine's home in Irving where "swald had store" some of his nossessions, officers recovered two nictures of Lee "server Cawald posing with a sun that looked identical to the sun found and meaning a ristel resembling the mistel used to kill "fficer Timpit. We were able to find by checking Cawald's former addresses where this picture was made in a tack yard at 21% #. Heeley.

- II. In the same sarage officers found two advertisements climped from some magazine showing this same type our offered for sale by Klains of Chicago.
- 12. In Oswald's murse was found an identification card and a registration card hearing the name of alex Hidell.
- 13. Postal Inspectors gave us information that at one time a fox had been rented in the name of Alex Hidell. The handwriting on this application was identified as that of Oswald. It was ascertained that the gum was shipped by Kleins of Chicago to this box. Postal Inspectors were also atle to find the money order itself used to pay for the gum. This information is not complete in our files, as we are waiting for some information from one of the Postal Inspectors who is ill at this time.
- 16. In Oswald's billfold was identification identifying him as a namber of the Fair Play for Cuba organisation. He told me that he was at one time secretary of the New Orleans branch and that the headquarters of this organization was in New York.
- IC. We found letters showing that Coweld had been corresponding with 'mold Johnson and 7. T. Lee. Photostats of these are attached.
- 16. Cawald had in his resession a notebook containing the names of Russian friends, telephone number and part of General Walker's name, F. B. I. Agent William Hosty's name and license number of his car. This is the agent who had been checking Oswald and his wife.
- 17. A tus transfer was found in Oswald's pocket and identified by the bus driver who carried Oswald a chort distance after the killing.
- 18. Oswald was positively identified by a cab driver, William Whaley, as the man he picked up near the Greyhound bus station, which is where Oswald left the bus, and took him to the 500 block N. Beckley near where Oswald had a room.

- 10. In searchine Dewald's room at 1026 N. Peckley a map of the City of Fallas was found with markings on it, one of which looked to be the seeme of the shooting.

 There was also what looked to be communistic literature.
- 20. Cawald was carrying, at the time of his arrest in the Texas Theater, a Smith and Wesson .38 califer revolver, serial # 510210. This is the same califer gun Officer Tippit was shot with when he stopped Cowald.
- 21. Two empty .38 cartridge cases were found by Parbara Jeanette Tavis and Virginia Tavis in front of their home, 100 K. Tenth Street, where they had seen Oswald throw them as he was reloading his gun. Four hullets were recovered from Officer Tippit's body and were of the same caliber as the gun Oswald was arrested with.
- 27. Welen Farkhem, 328 W. Ninth Street, saw Oswald shoot Officer Tirpit and restrively identified him in a lineup. Officer Tirpit was shot at 1:18 pm on November 22, 1963 in front of 1:00 F. Tenth Street. Several other witnesses identified him as the man seen running from the scene and toward the theater.

 W. W. Scoppins of 3138 Alaska saw Oswald shoot Officer Tirpit and identified him in a lineup.
- 73. We have from forty to fifty affidevits to substantiate all of this evidence.
