Ceneral Walker was scated at his dock at approximately 9:00 p.m. on April 10, 1953, when a bullet was fired through the window of the room and continued on through the wall to the loft of General Walker.

The bullet was recovered and released to Detestive G. D. Breen of the Crime Steme Scarch Sestion of the Dallas Police Department.

Mirk Coleman W/H/LA, 4333 Howsen heard the shot from his room and was listed as a witness. (See attachment I)

Detectives D. E. McElrey and I. F. VenGlance and a follow-to investigation a few minutes after the eriginal expert was received. They also interviewed a business associate of Constal Malher by the name of Robert Surrey W/M/95, 5905 Lindemped, IAS-7741. (See attachance 2)

Detectives C. R. Dellinger and F. M. Rose confirmed the investigation on April 11, 1953, and came to the condimies that the unknown acsaliant fired the chai from the alley directly morth of the rear of Comercal Malhor's house. Mr. Durrey was re-interviewed. (See attachment)

Detestive W. C. Chambers contacted Hirt Coleman, W/H/Lb, \$353 Heavier on April 11, 1963, and obtained information reparting the suspects being in one of several cars that were on the church parking lot that is adjacent to Coneral Walker's house. He definite information was obtained. (See attackment 4)

Detective J. B. Tempy contacted Mrs. Knocht, 5332 Deleache, EM3-3369 on April 12, 1963. Mrs, Knocht who was employed by General Walker listed a "Edll Buff" as a possible suspect. She

stated that Duff was a voluntary worker for General Walker.

Mr. Duff had been engaged to a Mics Whitley who was employed at 4223 Oak Lawn Avenue. Mies Whitley found that Mr. Duff had been borrowing nearly from Mrs. Unitley's exther. After this was known Mrs. Whitley checked with the British Embessy in Hemsten regarding Mr. Duff being an endgrant from Great Britain.

Mrs. Whitley could obtain no confirmation and the engagement was broken. (See attachment 5)

Lieutemant E. L. Cummingham and Detestive J. B. Toney contacted Er. Robert Surrey, 3525 Lindenwood, LAS-7741 on April 12, 1963. Er. Surrey was re-interviewed. Er. Surrey gave additional information regarding "Bill Duff". (See attackment 65)

Lieutemant E. L. Cummingham contacted Mrc. Whitley at \$223 Och Lawn who gave additional information on William Maskeam Duff, W/K/32, 4919 San Jacinto, Apartment 214, TAL-6134. Mr. Duff is an imagement from Sociland the came to America on Movember 6, 1957. He joined the Air Force in December, 1957 and two discharged in December, 1960. He came to Dallas from Los Angeles, California in Outober, 1962 and married Frances Baumard, 2001. Willia, TA7-2303. The marriage was assaulted after three todas. Mr. Duff had not held a regular job cinco arriving in Dallas.

Hr. Duff was arrested, questioned, photographed and fingerprinted and them released pending further investigation. (See attachments 7, 8 and 8-A.)

In June, 1963, two private investigators, Mr. Bill Receter, MUS-2765, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma and Mr. Cliff Recete, MUS-1567 contacted Licutement E. L. Cumningham caying they were employed by General Walker's attorneys, Leency, Matta and Leency of Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. They were investigating a "Fill Duff". They had contacted Mr. Duff and brought up the subject of killing General Walker. Apparently both Mr. Duff and the investigators considered the others covicus as the investigators contacted this Department and Mr. Duff reperted their actions to Special Agent thesis of the local P.B.I. Office. The investigators furnished a taps of part of their conversation with Mr. Duff. (See attachment 9 and separate exhibit H.)

William McEssan Duff was given a polygraph emmination by Detective R. D. Lewis on June 12, 1953 and the operator does not believe that Mr. Duff had any knowledge of the identity of assailant who fired at Coneral Walker. (See attachment 10 and 11).

Page 3 - General Edwin A. Walker

General walker received a threat by a long distance telephone prior to 8:55 p.m. on December 20, 1963. The call was from Kaplan, Louisiana. This information was given to Special Agent Carl Underhill of the local FBI Office.

Special Agent Bob Barrett of the local FBI Office notified this Department on December 30, 1953, that the long distance call on December 20, 1953 was made by Govald Grawford Vincent, White make of Kaplan, Louisiana. The Federal District Attorney at Hew Orleans declined to authorise a complaint being filed on Vincent. (See attachments 12 and 13).

The bullet recovered in General Walker's home on April 10, 1963, was released to Special Agent Eardwell Odom of the local F.B.I. on December 2, 1963 to be forwarded to the F.B.I. Laboratory in Washington. The laboratory made comparison tests with this bullet and the bullet and frequents resevered in connection with the assassination of President Remody. It was also compared with test bullets fired from the rifle resovered in the assassination investigation.

There were not sufficient markings to reach a positive conclusion although several similarities were present. (See attachment 14)

Mr. Forrest Serrelle, Special Agent in charge of the local Secret Service Field Office, forwarded to this Department of Describer 25, 1963 an emergy of an interview with Mrs. Marina Occald in which she stated her husband, Lee Harvey Octald, returned home on the night of April 10, 1963 very late and was extremely nervous. He finally told her that he had shot General Kalker with his rifle.

The excerpt also mentions a note that was left on a dresser with a post office key for her to use in case of his arrost. This note was whitten during the Walker episode and had nothing to do with President Kennedy's assassination. (This note is in hands of a federal agency) (See attachment 15.)

Although definite and absolute proof has not been obtained, there is a strong probability that the chot fired at Gonard Walker at 9:00 p.m. on April 10, 1963 was fired by Lee Harvey Ouwald.

A polygraph examination was given to William McEwan Duff upon the request of Lieutenant Cunningham to determine if he had any guilty knowledge about the shooting at General Edwin Walker. This test was conducted at 8:00 P.M. on June 12, 1963. Below is a list of pertinent questions

- 1. Do you have a grudge with General Walker? Answer: No
- 2. Did you shoot at General Walker? Answer: No
- 3. Do you remember who you were with the night General Walker was shot at? Answer: No
- 4. Have you given information to anyone about the activity of General Walker or the layout of the house except the two men from Oklahoma? Answer: No
- 5. Have you owned or had in your possession a high powered rifle since you have been in Dallas? Answer: No
- 6. Do you know who shot at General Walker? Answer: No

Lieutenant Cunningham set this appointment up and was the investigating officer. This officer had left a set of questions for Lieutenant Potts to bring with Mr. Duff to be examined. Lieutenant Potts was not familar with this case. Lieutenant Potts was advised there was a definite language barrier between Mr. Duff and the examiner because Mr. Duff was an immigrant.

Taking everything in consideration, it was the opinion of this examiner, that ir. Duff was truthful on all the above questions except question number three. Due to a lasp of time between the offense and examination, this person seemed puzzled over this question which could have caused the indication of deception. Due to the fact this person answered the other questions with the truth, it is believed Mr. Duff was confused rather than lying.

Gen Walker called this officer on June 6,1963 and stated that two private investigators had been checking on Bill Duff. He stated that sometime during the latter part of May an unknown lamy called his Secetary and told her that she knew that Bill Duff had told a Mr Charles Holloway, Apt. 123, 5420 Lewis, TA1-9091, That he Bill Duff, was the one who had shot at the General. I interviewed Mr. Holloway and he stated that Duff had never made such a statement, that Duff had moved into the Apt, with him several weeks prior to this time and that he had never talked of Gen. Waiker. Holloway stated that there was a number of people who did not like Duff and that he swed several people money. One of these people was a Mrs Juanita Buchanon who runs the Eldorado Bar on No. Haskell. Mrs Buchanon stated she Bid not make the call to the Walker home. But she did think that Duff was capable of doing such a thing as shooting at someone. She stated that she had cashed several checks for Duff that were signed by Herman Garrard, 6218 Lavesta. TA 7-3182. I interviewed Garrard and his Mother, Mrs Garrard. They stated that Duff had spent a night or so at their house and and borrowed money from them. Mrs Garrard denied making the phone call to the Genrals home. At this time it is unknown who the lamy is that made call to Compl. It is the openion of this officer that Bill Duff did not have anything to do with the assault on General Walker.

Results of examination:

The remaining physical characteristics of the bullet, Q188, are the same as those of the bullet and bullet fragments recovered in connection with the assassination of President John F. Kennedy and the same as those of 6.5 millimeter Mannlicher-Carcano bullets manufactured by the Western Cartridge Company. The mutilation of Q183 prevents stating that it is of Western manufacture to the exclusion of all other sources.

Specimen Q188 was fired from a barrel rifled with four lands and grooves, right twist. Mannlicher-Carcano rifles of the type used in the assassination of President Kennedy (described as specimen Kl in Laboratory report PC-78243 BX) are among those which produce general rifling impressions such as were found on specimen Q188.

Because of the extreme mutilation and distortion of Q188 and because the individual microscopic marks left on bullets by the barrel of the Kl rifle could have changed subsequent to the time Q188 was fired, it was not possible to determine whether or not Q188 was fired from Kl.

There are no specimens presently being maintained in the National Unidentified Ammunition File which could have been fired from the Kl rifle or which logically should be compared with Q188. Further, no bullets or rifles which logically should be compared with specimen Q183 have come to the attention of the FBI Laboratory since Earch, 1963.

The copper jacket and the lead core of the Q188 bullet were determined to be slightly different in compositions from the copper jackets and lead cores of the Q1 and Q2 bullets.

Although the differences in composition between the Q188 and the Q1 and Q2 bullets were small and do not indicate that these bullets represent two different types of bullets, it was not possible to determine if these bullets came from the same box. It is to be noted that there is no assurance in the fabrication of ammunition that all the ammunition ending up in one box possesses bullets from the same batch of metal, that is, with the same composition.

The bullet, Q189, is being temporarily retained in the Laboratory for comparison with any additional bullets which may be received.

Ro: Attempted assassination of General Edwin A. Walker, Dallas, Texas.

Dear Chief Curry:

The following information was developed by this Service relative to the attempted assassination of Retired General Edwin A. Walker, in Dallas, Texas, on April 10, 1963.

On December 2, 1963, there was received from the Irving Police Department, Irving, Texas, some belongings of Mrs. Marina Oswald which had been brought to the Police Station by Mrs. Ruth Paine with whom Mrs. Marina Oswald had been living. When these articles were examined in the Secret Service Office there was found in a book a note written in very poor Russian which was in the handwriting of Lee Harvey Oswald and which apparently was instructions to his wife what she should do in the event that he should be alive and taken as a prisoner.

On December 3, 1963 Mrs. Marina Oswald was questioned about this note by one of our special agents who speaks Russian and she stated that this note had nothing to do with the assassination of President Kennedy and that the note was written by her husband prior to his attempted assassination of former General Walker, whom she classified as the head of the Fascist Organization in the United States and who lived in Dallas, Texas, when they, the Oswalds, lived on Neely Street in Dallas; that the note, together with a Post Office key was left on a dresser of their bedroom and after reading the note she was afraid that her husband was planning on doing something dreadful due to his hate for the Fascist Organizations and their beliefs. She also stated that when her husband returned home late that night he was very nervous and finally told her that he shot Walker with his rifle and that it was best for everybody that he got rid of him.

Mrs. Oscald further stated that when it was learned the next day from rudios and newspapers that the rifle shot fired by an unknown person had missed Walker that she decided to keep the note as a threat against her husband so that he would not mistreat her again (it was determined that when the Oswalds lived on Neely Street that people living downstairs beneath the Oswalds had complained to the landlord about Oswald beating his wife) which he had promised not to do. She further commented that she did not report this matter to the Police as she loved her husband and particularly that she did not report it to the Police on account of their child. She stated,

Finever, that had the shot hit General Walker, that she would have reported the matter to the Police. She was apprehensive about this matter being reported to the Police because she had a fear of being taken in custody by the Police because the information contained in this letter regarding the General Walker incident and the rifle would show that she had not told the Police all she know when she was shown and questioned about the rifle that was used to assassinate President Kennedy.

On Dec. 10, 1953, our Special Agent had an opportunity to question Mrs. Marine Oswald rore in detail regarding the General Walker incident and she stated that Lee Harvey Oswald told her that once before taking the shot at General Walker on April 10, 1963, he had gone to the Walker residence for the same purpose but he had changed his mind as the place had not looked just right for him and that 3 days prior to April 10, 1963, he tock his rifle out of the house and buried it in a field near Walker's house. Mrs. Oswald further stated that upon her hugband's return to the house after he had tried to will General Walker and telling her about it that 3 days later she saw him taking his military green raincoat for the purpose of wrapping the rifle and bringing it home. However, she stated that when he returned home she did not see the rifle but several days later she saw the rifle on a shelf in the apartment where he always kept it. She also stated that the evening her husband shot at Walker he told her that the church which is located near the Walker house had some gathering; that there was plenty of noise and that after the shooting of Walker he buried the rifle in the same place.

Mrs. Marina Osuald further stated that Lee Harvey Osuald told her after reading in neuropers that some young man saw an automobile containing three win pulling every from the scene of the shooting, that the Americans always which they should have a car to get away from the scene of the crime but that he had rather use his feet to do so rather than a car, and he stated that he had taken a bus to go to the Walker residence and that he took a different bus to return home after the shooting.

Mrs. Firing Oscald was questioned as to how she was able to explain to nother-in-law, Mrs. Marguerite Oscald, concerning the attempted assassimation of General Walker by her husband, and she replied that she did to the best of her knowledge of the English language, and that no one else knew about the shooting at General Walker by her husband excepting her and her mother-in-law.




Ō PICTURE SHOT FROM OUTSIDE OF WINDOW WHERE BULLET ENTERED HOUSE EXHIBIT B




