Angela Davis To Be Limited On Jail Visits

SAN RAFAEL, Calif., Dec. 24 (AP)—Black militant Angela Davis will have strictly limited contact with her supporters outside of jail, spokesmen for the Marin County Sheriff's Department said today.

There is no television in her section of the jail. Newspapers occasionally, but not frequently, are allowed in the jail, and mail is carefully censored, said Lt. Newall Snyder, jail commander.

Miss Davis, 26, a former UCLA philosophy teacher, is charged with murder, kidnaping and conspiracy in the death of a judge at the Marin County Courthouse Aug. 7.

Snyder said visitors are allowed during a three-hour period two days a week, but each prisoner is limited to two visitors for a total of 20 minutes each visiting day. And deputies may listen to conversations between inmates and visitors.
