Gentlemen:

Both of your fine newsletters are being flattered by an imitation of which you may not be aware.

I am enclosing a marked copy of the second issue of The Phoenix Journal Express, ostensibly "channeled" by a being called Hatonn through or via a lady who uses the name DHARMA. Her actual name is Doris Ekker, aka Dorushka Maerd, Star Route 2, Box 30938, Tehachapi, CA 93561. Her indicated telephone number is (805) 822-0601. Publisher of The Phoenix Journal Express is George Green, America West Publishers, Suite 104-355, 6992 El Camino Real, Carlsbad, CA 92009. His indicated telephone number is (619) 431-9003.

Markings in yellow are from the Ron Paul Investment Letter of Feb. 15, 1990; (initial) green from the Ron Paul Political Report of Feb. 15, 1990, and (secondary) green from Executive Intelligence Review of Jan. 19, 1990.

My interest in this matter comes from my work on a current book about the U.S. involvement in drug trafficking during which I have come across (and cited) The Phoenix Journals, the Ron Paul and EIR newsletters, as well as much more additional material (my annotated bibliography is now 90 pages on the word processor). Familiarity with the subject matter contributed to early (August 1989) detection of the extended plagiarism and wholesale pilferage attendant to the Journals, virtually all of it without any credit to the true authors whatsoever. Since I (and other) authors must be guided by the fair comment doctrine or prior permission for extended quotations and, in all cases, by properly citing and referencing sources, the Hatonn-DHARMA material represents an ugly chapter of deception which unfairly clouds material that is essentially correct to start with but into which a "mickey" or two...or three, etc. may have been slipped.

Readers of H-D ordinarily are not in the position in which I find myself of viewing the current literature on these many related topics, and they may well, therefore, consider it as worthwhile and true but still mistakenly presume it to come directly from "Hatonn" whose obvious only talent is an amateurish impostorship.

Fallacious arguments, such as "God's Word can't be copyrighted," only add to the ludicrous inconsistencies in the Journals, which at one point were highlighted by instructions from Hatonn to obtain copyrights for the material purportedly flowing from him, including the Journals, the derivative newsletter, and assorted bulletins and tapes disseminated through an underground network of dupes and uninformed readers.

The extent of the plagiarism is so pervasive and endemic that I was not at all surprised to read in a letter from Dr. Antony Sutton in today's mail that "whole chunks" of his extensive writings have shown up in the Phoenix Journals which he termed both "a nuisance ... and a compliment in a way."

Tony also noted the peculiarity of a "channeler" stooping to the use of lengthy unattributed quotes from newsletters -- which may say something about the channeler and also perhaps about the quality of the newsletters.

In an earlier letter to Mr. Green (Feb. 12), which my intelligence sources say will be the subject of extensive comments in the "seventh" Journal Express newsletter due out later this week and in which "Commander" Hatonn rebukes me, I spoke of other documented plagiarisms, including a seven-page disclaimer from 90-year-old Sister Thedra of Sedona and formerly of Mt. Shasta, with 40 years of service as a consistently accurate and loving channel; the entire second half of Sipapu Odyssey from Tuieta; much material stolen from the respected works of the late George Hunt Williamson; extensive lifting from William Cooper who is writing about a secret government alliance with alien space beings (and who is simultaneously exalted and vilified by Hatonn, perhaps because of his threat to bring suit for the plagiarism), and uncredited material taken from work of Pastor Lindsey Williams (about international banking) and Jonathan May (who speaks of one-world plots). These examples are word-for-word, page-after-page, no-attribution thefts.

If the offense were merely that of stealing the works of others, it might be passed off as a tortured underachiever seeking to bask in the glory of others. But there is another even more insidious aspect to Hatonn. Rasputin-like, he has pervaded the consciousness of the Ekkers (DHARMA and Oberli) to the extent they themselves have been suckered into incipient con games which are patently fraudulent. In Survival Is 10 Feet From Hell, Hatonn tried to convince humanity to hide in bomb shelters and guard their meager food supply from marauders. Because time is so short, Hatonn writes, the most economic way to build these vital shelters is by using a unique compressed earth brick which can be obtained from a California businessman, a certain E.J. Ekker in Tehachapi, Calif. Hatonn fails to mention that Ekker is the same individual referred to in the Journals as "Oberli," the mate of DHARMA, whose real name is Doris Ekker of Tehachapi, Calif.

The "Great Pig Iron Fiasco" is another scam perpetrated by Hatonn, the victim this time being Oberli who was told to buy platinum and gold which had been miraculously transformed out of pig iron on the back of a truck, unbeknownst to the truck driver. After buying a small sample (Oberli apparently doesn't fully trust Hatonn), he took the ingots to an assayer who reported they were "just pig iron." Hatonn didn't blink a wink; he told the insider group "dark forces had pulled a switch and transmuted the gold and platinum back into pig iron."

And so it goes.

As more interdimensional "short wave" (didn't anyone ever tell Hatonn about the FCC?) adventures get into print, more folks are going to begin to hear how much Hatonn sounds like Satan. As more see the laughingstock aspect of this effort, there will could be a compensatory boost in the discrimination levels of readers. However, unfortunately there will always be a hard-core segment which will be misled and enmeshed by the truths being palmed off by master deceivers and impostors who make a mockery of the expression "The Truth Shall Make You Free."

Your newsletters show awareness that negative or conspiratorial data can be handled in a positive manner. On the other hand, the Journals depend on fear in their presentation of the "truth," because fear crumbles the defense of the souls who are, of course, the target of you know who.
