

violence and that people will be swayed by Black Power groups, mainly composed of young Negroes of Memphis who will not sit still for the same treatment that "oldtime" Negroes in Memphis have gone along with. He advised that he believes outside groups of the Black Power variety will come into Memphis, Tenn., and will find conditions suitable for violence if the sanitation employees are not given a living wage. The Negroes who are workers will not trust LOEB until the strike is settled fairly prior to their going back to work. He has always felt that racial violence would not occur in Memphis; however, in recent weeks as a result of the strike he feels the climate is certainly proceeding in a violent direction.
