It makes no sense at all that the Mexican police would beat Buran and get her to say she had sex with Oswald and then not include that in its reports to the WIA. And when was Duran going to go out with Oswald, while she was at work? Or fifter work when she was with her husband or he'd have been suspicious of her absence.

Would she had treated Oswald? The did not have the money with which to entertain her. Where would they have had sex several times? In his hotel room and not have had that observed? At her home? She could hardly have wanted to bad enough to have used some back alley.

The only date is written on, Ma/y 26, 1967. That was at the height of the Garrison international publicity.

It does not seem likely that any Fexican woman would have found Oswald attractive endugh to run any risks to have sex with him. Not with all the men who go through any consulate.
