Even the Elder operation did, as Hal ¹art may remember from taking me there a couple of times to collect, each time with a promise made and not kept.

In fact, there is but a single distributor I know I'll be able to use, in NH. All the other major ones are as money and there is no point in giving them more they'll not pay for.

I was in NYC last week. When there I visited for a while with the one agent who really tried for me. He told me what he probably can't prove, that he is certain that there is a concerted federal effort to keep me from being published. This was from his experience. And with the book that turned the Ray case over. (There was a preliminary hearing on it today, on discovery motions for the evidentiary hearing. I was to have been there but declined instead to do what remains to be done on this newest work.)

It is put together as it never has been. I must finish it and look for a publisher. And once tax season starts, I'll have no typist. It is the one time of the year we have income, my wife's.

But I do wish I could get out there again. If only for "halloes."
