Yes, I completed a series of 4 operations on my eyes on September 25. Two operations on each eye. When I become more disabled will have cataracts removed. I seldom wear glasses and then only for reading. The last two operations were:

Microsurgical anterior trabaculectomy with peripheral iridectomy and paracentsis

Pressure sometime went over 40 but with the operations pressure is holding around 15 in each eye and no more drops. I had used drops, of all kinds ended with Timoptic for 16 years.
