
SUBJECT: ASSASSINATION OF  
PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY

"SA B. TOM CARTER called at approximately 11:45, a.m., 11/23/63, and said he had reviewed all the news pictures taken by WBAP-TV, with the assistance of JAMES BARNES, News Director for the station. CARTER said there were no pictures of any use to this case in those taken by the station, that all of the pictures were taken from the north side of the street and, as a consequence, do not show the pertinent building."

CARTER passed on "for what it's worth" the suggestion of BARNES that the Bureau publicize they are interested in obtaining any pictures taken in the vicinity of the shooting of the President. He said this would bring up a large number of pictures unquestionably from the public and we could review them for any that might be of assistance in this matter. BARNES told CARTER "practically everyone had a camera". It is not believed the above procedure warranted at this time.
