In 1968, the Assistant Director of CRD was Thomas E. Bishop.
The Front Office consisted of Mr. Bishop; a Number 1 Man, James F.
Bland; a Number 2 Man, Harold P. Leinbaugh; and a Number 3 Man, Hobson A.
Adcock. All news and media inquiries were the responsibility of these
four individuals. Exceptions to this policy were weekends and other
occasions of absence, at which time their functions were handled by
other designated personnel of the CRD.

The Research Section of the CRD was responsible for researching and frequently preparing press releases. In some instances, when voluminous media sources needed to be advised concerning a particular press release, Research Section personnel assisted. However, in the normal course of business, matters involving press releases and relations with all media contacts were handled by the Front Office of the CRD.

Where information is not provided, it is either not retrievable or is not being furnished pursuant to the Memorandum of Understanding.
