Your avoidance of thisk is but another of the disgreceful federal and Sec et Sorvice misconducts. Cortaintly a prerequisi for being either Director of sistant Direct is the ability to read the snguage.

I not renew both requests: for a copy of the document and, if you refuse it, a citation of the authority that empowers this; and if you do not within a reasonable time provide this documentx, I renew my request for a copy of all instructions and forms re wired to invoke the Freedom of Information act or a citation of the authority to refuse to do this. I am determined to not only get what I am entitled to but to make my government work, to the degree I can.
