RE: Assassination of President John F. Kennedy - White House files.

Follow-up of your question, re: Secretarial 77, the Alonso Martinez report by SAW
and Mr. Justice, dated 3/20/71, re: "Assassination of President Kennedy - White House files".
The report states, "After a careful examination of the contents of all
of the files, it appears, however, that there is no evidence which would point to the
fact that the assassin was connected with the FBI or any other Federal Agency, either directly
or indirectly, or in any way, or in any capacity." Your question is answered.
I am enclosing herewith a copy of the original service to a defendant, which
is a potential suspect in the assassination of President Kennedy. The conclusion is
not very strong, but as I have said, the circumstances of things indicate the
possibility of connection with aspects of the assassination of the President in which
a, the secret service did not catch up, the FBI would not be able to find and
if you enclosed this with the original L. M. report, I think, since the
FBI has told you this is a copy of the original service to you, you know I
will make it accessible to you, so you are free to read this letter to police this. Further,
