The name in the records of the photographer is Mr. John T. Stringer, Jr. A check of the Maryland Suburban phone book shows a John T. Stringer, Lt. Cdr., USNR Ret 4612 Roxbury Drive, Bethesda WH2-3530.

This address is close to the Navy Hospital.

If this is the man, not the father, he should be able to testify to how many of what pictures he took, with what kind of equipment, for what purpose(s) and under whose orders, and whether he was properly exposed, how he exposed and determined exposure, whether he had every reason to believe there was no defect in his film, practises, etc., and what, if anything, could normally cause the film he exposed to "show no image" on

I can seek an interview with him to ask him these questions, if he declines it, I can write him a registered letter asking the answers, etc., but I will await hearing from you before doing anything.

The evidence is so overwhelming that he turned in good stuff, properly exposed film, that I think the best course is to approach him openly and directly, which I would do for my writing anyway, let him decline for whatever reason, make a record if it, and then subpoena him. The letter would then make a rather good exhibit as it will make a record.
