Dear Mrs. Field,

Kind notes like your mean much. We thank you for it and the enclosures, which I am glad to get. Anything more like it in the future will also be worthwhile and appreciated, but do not include BOOKS, for I have just subscribed. Its editor, Jerome Agel, sort of adopted us after he read Whitewash. He was most helpful in so many ways, not the least of which was in introductions. This helped get us the five distributors who now stock the book, including Reymar, Monrovia, Calif., forat the west coast. Mr. Fran Howell, a very nice fellow and one of the partners, phoned yesterday. He had 500 copies and apparently had none in San Francisco ten days ago. Then there was the Joe Dolan program (what a nice guy!) and suddenly Reymar needs 500 more. He phoned and said it's wildfire in Frisco! He may, he thinks, soon need another 1000. (Stock check yesterday, 725 of the 5000). This is wonderful if the printer, who hasn't yet been paid for the current edition, will trust me further. Individual orders have been very good, now averaging about ten a day, and they are paid for usually by return mail. But the wholesale end takes a while. So, we haven't enough on hand to make a real dent in the bill. I hope to see him Tuesday if the airlines strike doesn't keep him from a scheduled return to Washington.

Meanwhile, so many other things are looking up. I had five hours on the Long John Nebel show on WNBC in New York (which, I believe, is what sold one of the distributors there out of his first 500) but those wretched fascists on it with me were so helpful, that by the time they started to peter out after 3 1/2 of what I'm confident were their most frustrating hours, I decided I'd done enough for a night and let it peter. I now still have fresh material for other shows, and the shows are now coming. Four hours in Philadelphia in ten days, followed by TV next day. A NY TV show this coming Thursday, a show for four educational TV stations - Washington, Phila., Boston and NY (any in Calif that might use the tape if available?), and a BBC five-minute thing, something like Huntley-Brinkley. I've told their Washington men about the other books and he'll mention them and close with 2-minutes of interview on which we'll photograph some of the more sensational documents for flashing on the British screens.

Arriba, Madrid, cabled this morning asking for Spanish serialization rights.

I'm spending every minute I can grab on Knebel and a sequel, which is proceeding slowly but fruitfully. Despite Sylvia Meagher's high opinion of Inquest, I find dilly it is really a harmful book because of the error of its doctrine and fact. When the Knebel's find the factual error in it, it'll be worse. But answering Knebel leads to some wonderful stuff, so good it surprises me. LOCK hasn't answered my challenge of two weeks ago, but I'm continuing with this not because I expect an answer but because I now have to dilute myself answering for Epstein.

Sometime when I have more time and you can spare them I'd like to see your writing.

I sure wish we could do something on LA radio like San Francisco, for which Hal Verb really deserves the credit...If we go back to press, there'll be an index, almost completed, with the rest of the pages required for a full (32pp) or half signaturesx other pictures from the 26 volumes. Any suggestions? Many thanks to all you nice Calif. people.
